

I. Institutional Graduation Requirements

A Complete a minimum of 180 credit hours at the 100 level and above with the following restrictions:

____1. A minimum of 60 credit hours of upper division coursework (300-400 level).

_____2. A minimum of 45 credit hours from EOU of which 30 must be upper division, under supervision of EOU faculty.

3. A maximum of 90 credit hours in one discipline applied to the B.S. degree and 75 credit hours in one discipline applied to the B.A. degree.

4. No more than 12 credit hours in PE activity courses, music activity courses, or INTACT courses (Music majors exempt).

5. No more than 45 credit hours of practicum course work.

6. No more than 120 credit hours of lower division courses.

C ____Completed first-year writing courses as required by placement testing (i.e., WR 121).

Students must earn an EOU GPA of at least 2.00 and a composite GPA of 2.00 for all college work taken until the time the degree is conferred. A transfer GPA and the Eastern GPA are combined at the time of graduation.

II. Program Requirements

A Lower Division Professional Courses. 10 courses, 24 credits, 3 credits each. These courses, or their equivalents, must have been completed before admission to EOU's FSA program. This rule includes students who have earned an associate degree in fire science that did not include these courses. (Under certain circumstances, the FSA degree coordinator may waive or partially waive a fire science requirement, but 24 lower division credits are still required.) Chemeketa Community College, among other institutions, offers these courses through distance learning.
