UNIVERSITY ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

The University Achievement Awards are offered to incoming freshman based on their high school GPA or GED score. No SAT/ACT test scores are required for this award. Students will be automatically offered this award based on their GPA or GED score, and date of admission to EOU.

RENEWAL CRITERIA:

The University Achievement Award is renewable for up to 12 terms (4-year equivalency). To maintain eligibility for this award, students must maintain a cumulative 2.75 GPA and complete 40-credit hours at EOU, per regular academic year (fall, winter, and spring terms). Additionally, the fund will increase each year the student successfully satisfies the renewal requirements. The Financial Aid Office will monitor your academic progress and determine eligibility to renew, after spring term of each academic year.

The University Achievement Award cannot be awarded simultaneously with the, University Scholar, University Scholarly-Need, Transfer & Returning Student Success Award, or the Continuing Student Success Award, as these are partner programs. If a student is receiving other Institutional Awards, their total institutional aid cannot exceed the cost of their total tuition. *Consortium or dual-enrolled students will only receive credit toward their award for the credits they are taking at Eastern Oregon University.

REQUIREMENTS TO RECEIVE FUNDS:

To guarantee receipt of these funds, the student must accept the award offer no later than 30 days after the postmark. All awards not accepted within this timeframe, will be forfeit and the funds will be reallocated to other eligible candidates.

Awards are based on full-time enrollment and will not be paid to students that are registered for less than fulltime (12 credit hours per term). Study abroad programs do not count as credits registered with EOU.

One-third of these award funds will be released directly into the student account each term and will apply toward tuition.
